The next step for CAP flight academy graduates!


Do you want to earn your plot's license?

Are you an aspiring military aviator?

Apply for a Daedalian Flight Scholarship!

Through this scholarship program, the Daedalians will typically reimburse selected CAP cadets up to **\$2,100** to help off-set the cost of earning an FAA Private Pilot's Certificate.

The flight training is self-paced and conducted at the cadet's hometown airport by a certified flight instructor of their choosing. It's a great opportunity!



Eligibility Requirements

- ▶ Active CAP cadet
- ▶ Recipient of the Billy Mitchell Award
- ▶ Aspiring military aviator
- ▶ Possess vision 20/50 or better, corrected to 20/20
- ▶ Have not already earned a private pilot's license
- ▶ Be at least 16 but not yet 19 on 1 June of the scholarship year.

Other factors. Cadets who have some previous flight experience are preferred (ie: powered or glider flight academy graduates, solo badge winners, cadets who have made CAP orientation flights, etc.). Cadets must have superb time management skills and a proven ability to see goals through to their completion.

How to Apply

Visit the CAP website and follow the application instructions. Deadlines may vary each year. Historically, applications have been due to HQ CAP by 1 March for the scholarship year that begins on 1 June.
